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EXTENSION AND OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

Lenora Institute of Dental Sciences plays an important role in the extension and outreach activities like blood donation, women empowerment. In addition, outreach programs and invited lectures are also given to the community. Apart from these, our college took a greater effort to eradicate the new life style diseases, in which the dental caries is regarded as one. College aged students are facing an important transitional stage in their oral health status. They are approaching a period when they are at an increased risk of periodontal disease. At the same time, restorations placed during adolescence may be in need of replacement. While these oral changes are occurring, the student is undergoing lifestyle changes that may further exacerbate his or her oral condition. Dietary changes, for example, may adversely affect dental decay patterns. In this context, our college had achieved a milestone to gain awareness of the progressive nature of oral diseases among college aged students, understand what they can do to prevent them, and accept the responsibility to care for their oral health needs. This was reached by conducting several health awareness programmes in and around the college premises. This has inculcated the positive attitude towards the treatment rendered to oral diseases, even among the public.

Even the program was designed on a “student-to-student” basis, where dental students and campus residents would interact as peers. Hence making it a patient-friendly environment in the hospital. The outreach programme was even conducted in the student dormitories as an extension activity, that was coordinated between the dental students, who provided a description of the services offered by the program, and the dormitory administrative staff, who were responsible for publicizing the program.
